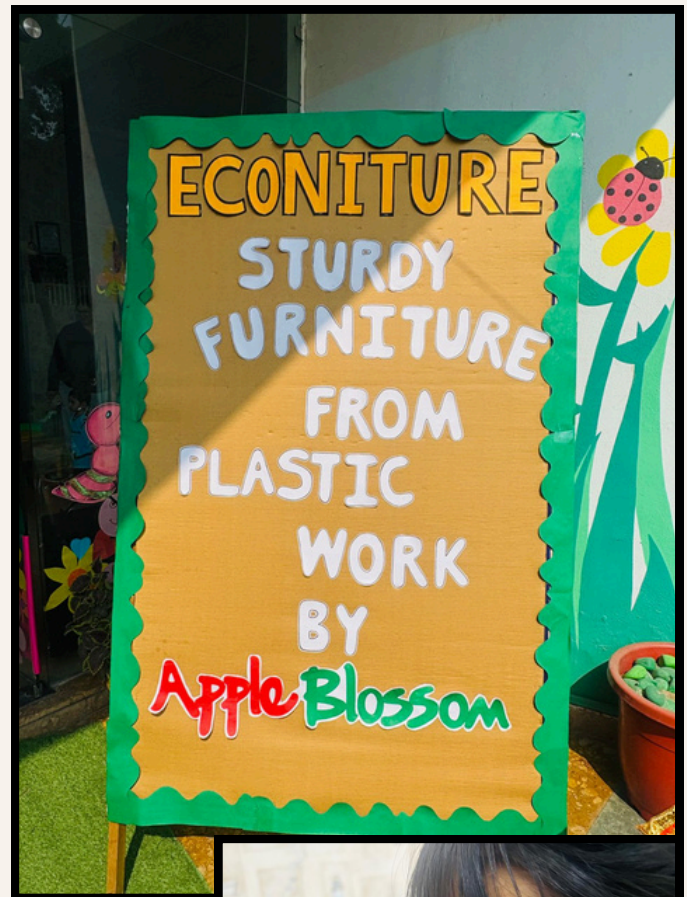
Through these experiences, our young changemakers are truly sewing seeds of sustainability, building habits for a cleaner, kinder planet.

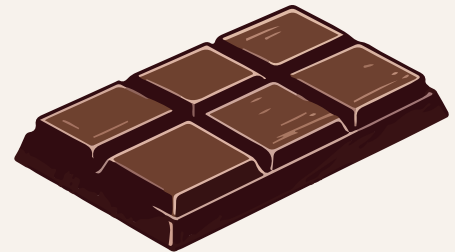
Chocolate Day Delights!

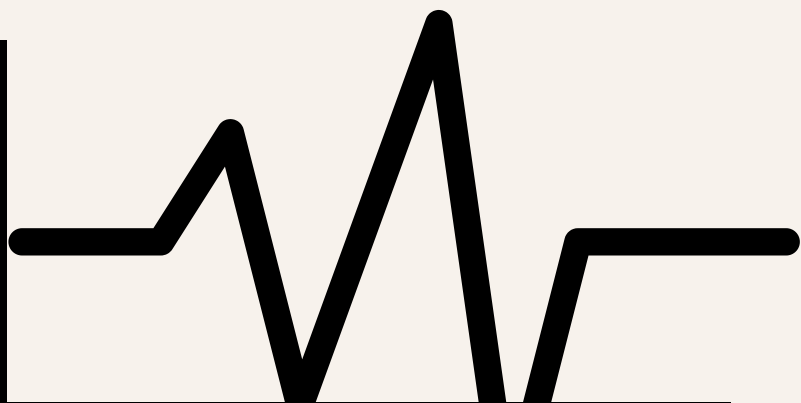
