### SCHOOL RULES OF CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

- Each student should carry the Almanac to School everyday.
- Students should be neat and tidy in school uniform on school days, open days and for all school functions.
- All entries in almanac must be complete.
- The school building and property must be respected. Any damages done to the school property will be realized from the student responsible.
- No student above Class VIII can come casually dressed on birthdays or any other occasion.
- Celebration of birthdays in the school canteen is not allowed.
- Scribbling on walls and boards is a punishable offence.
- The observance of the rules of discipline of the school and good behavior is an essential pre-requisite for a student's continuance in school. In case a Student violates the school rules, indulges in any form of indiscipline, strict actions like expulsion, suspension/rustication shall be taken against the student.
- Bullying and use of foul language are punishable offences.
- No student shall indulge in the following practices:
  - o Spitting in or near the school building
  - Whistling or shouting
  - Damaging school property
  - o Rowdyism
  - o Use of violence in any form
  - o Casteism, communalism or practice of untouchability
  - o Smoking, use of drugs, intoxicants, gutka and panmasala
- The School reserves the right to suspend or take disciplinary action against a student whose progress is unsatisfactory or whose conduct is harmful to other students.
- No valuables like expensive watches, mobiles, i-pods, i-pads, surplus money should be brought to school.
- Mobiles once confiscated, no claim will be entertained. The school phone is available for all students in cases of emergency.
- Half days will not be allowed to any child unless there is a medical or valid reason and the parents come to school and accompany and child back to home.
- Students who have been sick should bring a Medical Certificate from the Doctor on the day of re-joining School.
- Parents should fill up the ''Record for Non-attendance'' for each day the student has been absent from School stating the reasons for his absence.
- Students are not granted leave outside the regular vacation periods(except in case of illness). Students who do not join school on the days of reopening after vacations are liable to have their names struck off the school rolls unless otherwise informed earlier.

- A student returning to school after a contagious/infectious disease should produce a
  doctor's certificate permitting him fit to attend school. Students suffering from the
  following diseases must observe the prescribed period of quarantine before returning
  to School.
  - o Chicken pox till scabs fall off.
  - o Cholera till the child is completely well.
  - o Measles-2 weeks after the rashes disappear.
  - o Mumps-until the swelling is gone; about 1 month.
  - o Whooping Cough-6 weeks.
  - o Jaundice-6 weeks
  - o Swine Flu-till the time the doctor specifies fit.
  - Repeated absence without leave or un-explained absence for more than 3 weeks renders the child's name struck off from the rolls.
  - It is compulsory for students from Classes I to XII to maintain 90% attendance during the entire academic session so that they are eligible to appear for their final assessments. This can however be relaxed on medical grounds and the Principal's decision is final.
  - A certificate of merit will be given to students with 100% attendance.

#### FEE RULES & REGULATIONS

The school fees should be submitted as under – classes Pre-Nursery to V & XI – XII (ICICI Bank), classes VI to X (HDFC Bank) at Prayagraj, through Fee Deposit Books provided by the school.

The Bank will accept the fees by cash or draft payable at Prayagraj, drawn in favour of Delhi Public School, Prayagraj.

- Fees can also be paid online by logging in student's portal.
- For your convenience, fee can be paid by cash at school counter after the bank closes deposit of quarterly fee.
- Payment of fees through card will be accepted at the school office only.
- Late fine of Rs. 500 per month will be charged in case of late payment.
- In no case should the school dues be allowed to fall into arrears. If the school fees fall into arrears for both tuition and transport for a quarter the name of the student will be deleted from the school roll, without further notice and re-admission may not be granted. If re-admission is granted the entire fees and necessary formalities, as processed for a new student, will apply to the case.
- Parents /Guardians are requested to please keep the fee deposit book for their record and for reference, if and when, required by the school.
- Fees for all classes will be collected in the bank on the dates as mentioned in the fee book.

<sup>\*</sup>Amount of Rs. 5000/- (Non Refundable) will be charged as Re-admission fee for class XI.

#### ADMISSIONS/WITHDRAWALS

- The Principal reserves the right, to refuse admission to any, without furnishing a reason.
- Formal admission is complete only after the application form has been considered by the Principal, the parent informed about decision, and an admission card signed by the Principal issued. Ordinarily this is after an interaction/entrance test. The residential address as mentioned in the application form, if changed later, must be intimated to the school, at the earliest.
- At the time of admission, a student must produce a satisfactory evidence of date of birth, Aadhar card or an affidavit certifying his date of birth. No student will be admitted to the school without a Transfer Certificate, from the last school which she/he attended. The original and photo-copy of the previous school's mark sheet of a class lower than to which the child is seeking admission must be submitted by the 1st week of April.
- Date of birth once entered in the admission form by the Parent will not be changed.
- The school leaving certificate of a student joining school from Classes VI-XII
  must be countersigned by the Educational Authority of the District in which the
  previous School is situated for children coming from any State other than Uttar
  Pradesh.
- As per the CBSE norms, a student will not be allowed to change his subjects in Class XI once the registration has been done.
- A School Leaving Certificate will not be issued until all fees is paid and dues are clear. Those who leave in mid-session will have to pay for the full term.
- For withdrawal of a pupil from the school, a calendar months notice must be given in writing, before school closes for vacations, otherwise a calendar months fees will be charged.
- A student, who fails for two consecutive years in the same class will be asked to leave the School.

#### **CONVEYANCE RULES**

- The student is expected to arrive at his pick-up point 5 minutes before the scheduled time.
- If a child wants to withdraw from the bus facility, one month's prior notice will have to be given by the parent in writing in the Accounts Office.
- Students are expected to behave and be seated in their places.
- No student is allowed to get down from bus before assigned stop.
- No diversion or extension will be made on existing routes.
- The Bus Co-ordinator and the Bus Monitor are responsible for maintaining discipline.
- The list of students and their respective stops will be there in the bus.
- Although strict security measures have been taken, in case of any mishap, the school will not be held responsible for the same.

#### **HOUSE SYSTEM**

The house system provides a good platform for the holistic development of students. It forms the basis of all competitions in the school and promotes team spirit, group loyalty and healthy competition. The school is divided into six houses after the names of the rivers i.e. Chenab, Ganga, Yamuna, Jhelum, Ravi & Satluj. Students compete for the Inter-house competitions, demonstrating their talents and skills, bringing laurels to their respective houses.

- Grey Full Trouser with White Full Shirt with school monogram (I to XII)/ House T-Shirt and Track Suit to be worn on Wednesday & Friday.
- Grey Socks with two green stripes.
- Black School Shoes, Tie and School Belt.

#### Note:-

• Half/Full 'V'-Neck Bottle Green Sweater with monogram (for both Boys and Girls) from Classes I to XII.

Blazer is compulsory for all students except on Wednesdays.

#### Note:

- 1. No fancy hair clips, nail paint or jewellery is allowed.
- 2. Girls must wear right length of skirt. They are to wear cycling shorts.
- 3. Girls must tie their hair neatly with bottle green hair band/ribbons (No other colours are allowed)
- 4. The cut of the trousers should be straight, fancy trousers are not permitted.
- 5. House Uniform with sports shoes to be worn on Wednesday & Saturday.

#### **GUIDELINES FOR PARENTS**

- 1. Parents should foster in their children habits of neatness, diligence, regularity, punctuality and respect.
- 2. Parents are expected to co-operate in the smooth functioning of the School especially in enforcing discipline and by evincing interest in their child's progress by extending their support and encouragement and to see that their ward participates in co-curricular and extra curricular activities.
- 3. Parents are expected to sign their child's Progress Report and any other written communication conveyed through the Almanac.
- 4. Every student when called upon to attend extra classes or take part in any activities of the school must compulsorily do so.
- 5. Parents can meet their ward's Class teacher on every 2nd and 4th Saturdays of the month between 9 11 a.m.
- 6. Visiting Hours: Principal 9:00am to 11:00 am (only on Tuesday & Saturday).
- 7. Encourage your ward to take a balanced interest in studies, co-curricular activities and sports.
- 8. Restrict daily pocket money, excessive spending should be discouraged. The school/class will not be responsible for the loss of money from the school.
- 9. Do not send gifts/expensive cards for any school authorities for any occasion/teacher day or birthdays.
- 10. Do not give any money to your ward for any collection, charity, etc unless you get a written information.
