Overview

The Women in School Leadership (WISL) Program is a professional learning program for a select group of women Principals from Delhi and Victoria. The 2023-24 program will support principals to engage in an online professional learning program and reciprocal immersion experiences in Delhi/Bangalore and Victoria during 2023 and 2024.

Theme

This program will support its participants to explore opportunities on Leading schools for social change with a focus on health and wellbeing. This theme aligns to VATL Domain 1: Leading teaching, learning and wellbeing, and FISO 2.0 'student learning and well-being' central outcome. It also aligns to NEP pedagogical and curricular restructuring, aimed at promoting better learning, development, and wellbeing.

The program will be developed and delivered by **Asia Education Foundation (AEF)** in partnership with the **Australia India Institute** and **Melbourne Graduate School of Education** at the University of Melbourne and the **Centre for India Australia Studies** at OP Jindal Global University.

Online Professional Learning Program

The WISL Program will include:

- 20 hours of online, formal professional learning focusing on educational leadership, system knowledge-building, comparative education policy and practice and action research.
- Professional Immersion in India and Melbourne
- Leadership coaching sessions per participant (up to 2 sessions per participant).

During the program, participating teachers will build and apply their skills across key topics, as they relate to the over-arching theme of wellbeing and intercultural understanding:

- Diversity and Inclusion
- Student Centred learning (with a focus on engaging girls)
- Creative and Experiential Pedagogy
- Assessment

The program is unique in that it is built around a cycle of action research and collaborative community of practice. Women Principals from Australia and India will come together in small groups and will pursue a project drawn from one of the key themes. Each group will be provided with a Coach to help them integrate relevant perspectives into their action plan. This will allow principals from Australian and Indian schools to apply their learning to their own school context through an applied action research project resulting in strengthening school culture and pedagogies, leading to a positive impact on student and community outcomes.

Professional Immersion - School-based enquiry

The school-based enquiry element of the WISL Program, provides participating Principals with the opportunity to explore their key areas of interest within a school context and opportunities for collaboration and exchange.

Victorian Principals and Delhi Principals have been paired based on common areas of interest and opportunities for learning. The Delhi principals will host their Victorian counterpart in their school for 2.5 days. This will provide opportunities to:

- develop a more in-depth understanding of each other's school and education system.
- investigate your key area/s of interest with their counterparts.
- explore opportunities for collaboration and exchange.
- experience something of the diversity of India's cultures.

After identifying the focus areas for the school-based enquiry, the Host Principal will develop a program for the Guest Principal. Host Principals will draw on their local knowledge and experience to facilitate a program.

The following outlines some of the types of experiences to be considered when negotiating and planning the Guest Principal's program:

- **Introduction to the host school and relevant staff:** tour of relevant facilities, attend and speak at a school-assembly, introduction to relevant senior staff/management etc.
- **One-on-one time:** this should occur regularly so that the paired Principals can reflect on progress and plan future learning.
- **Investigative time:** to explore and reflect on the themes of the program and the focus areas for the Guest Principal's school-based enquiry. This could include:
 - Shadowing the Host Principal: to understand the context of their work and investigate the key focus area/s.
 - o Group meetings with relevant leaders: including teachers, students and parents to explore and interrogate the key areas for enquiry.
 - Meetings or networking opportunities: arranged by the Host Principal with other relevant leaders that can add to the learning e.g., Principals from other schools, businesses, education authorities, non-government organisations (NGOs) working with the school and community, visit/s to other Delhi schools in the WISL program, etc.
 - Observing programs in action: observing classroom or community programs, interacting with teachers and students etc.
 - Contributing to the learning: scheduling a briefing or professional development workshop to be presented by the Guest Principal on a key area of interest.

- **Individual reflection time:** for the Principals to review progress and consider implications for future activities.
- **Planning time:** for the paired Principals to reflect on their learning, plan for future collaboration and investigation, develop a presentation on their shared and individual learnings and plan for the reciprocal visit to Victoria.
