# Heritage India Poster Making Competition

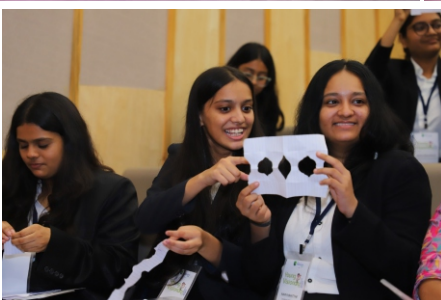

We extend our heartfelt gratitude to the supportive parents, whose unwavering belief in their little superheroes made this event truly extraordinary.

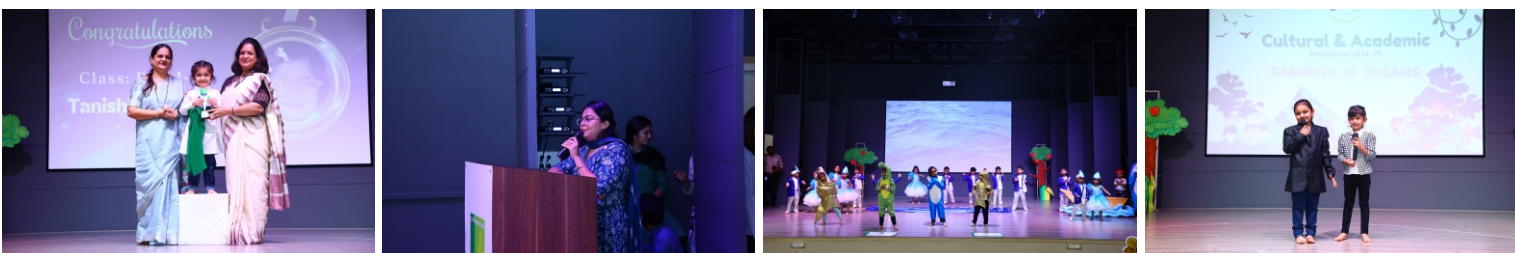

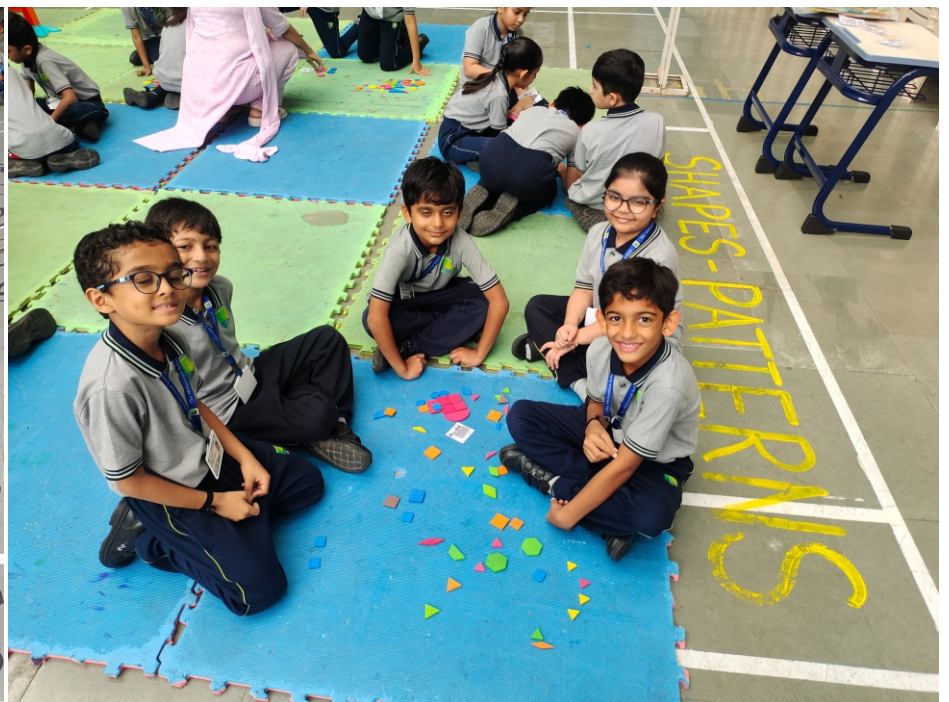
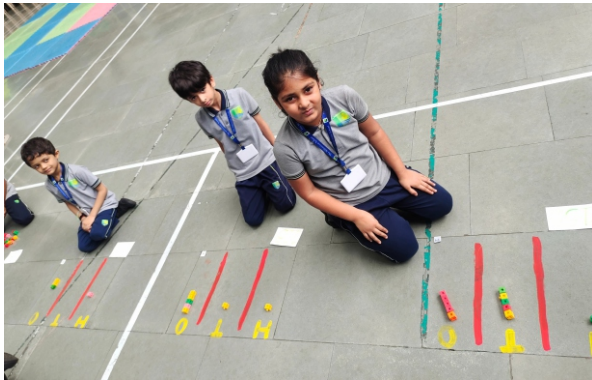
## EVS - Clothes

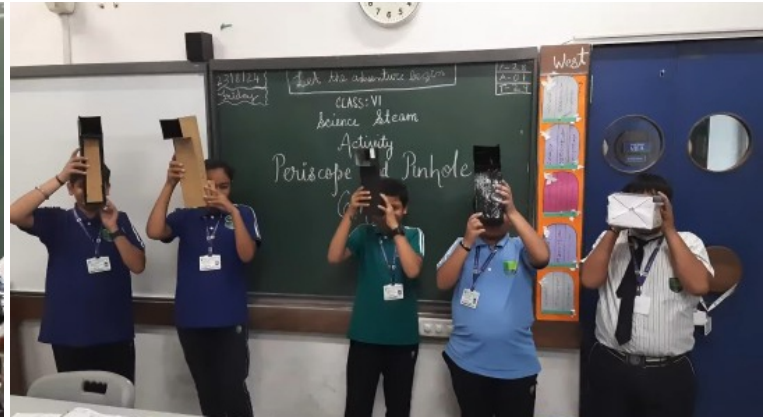

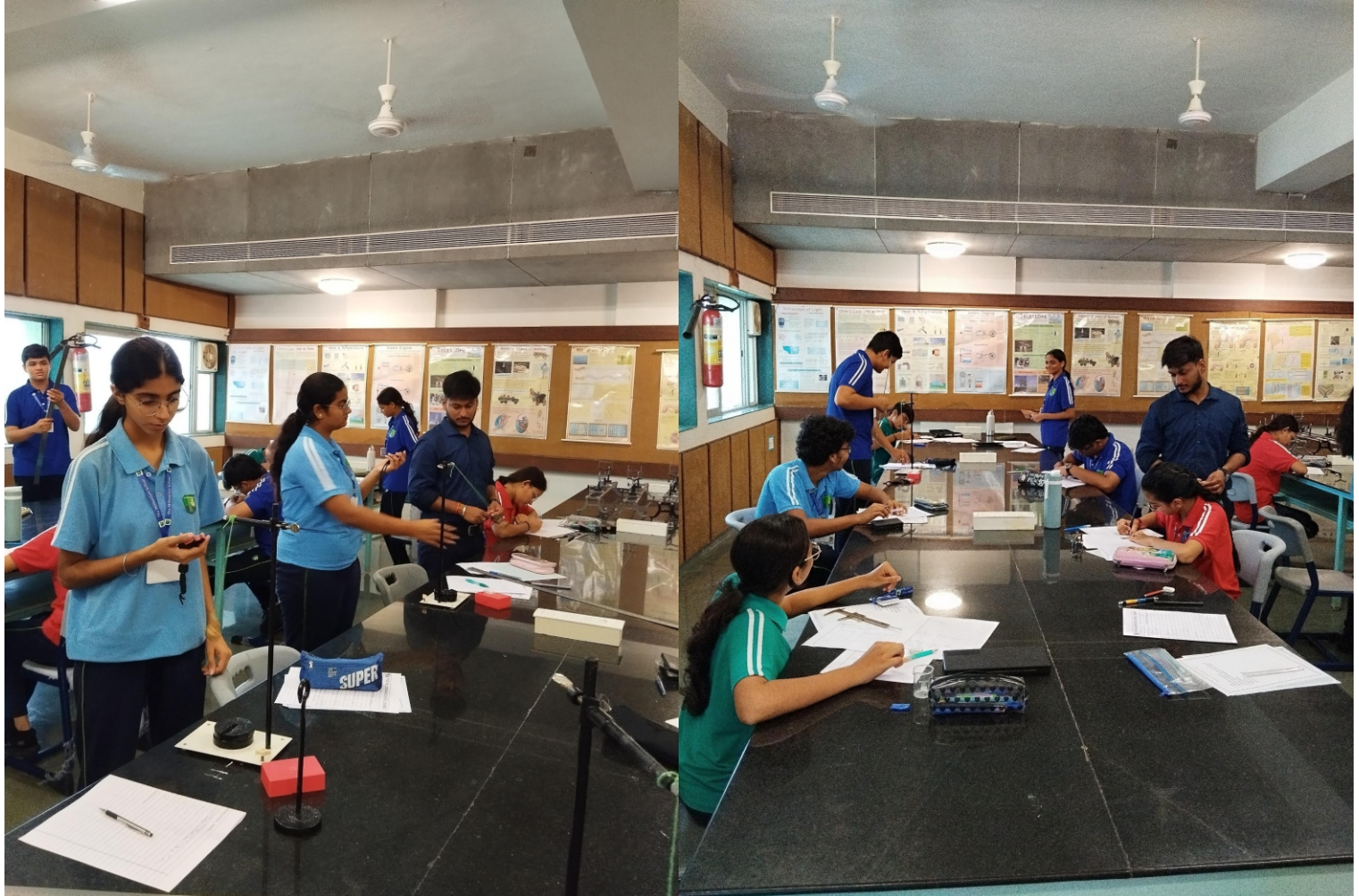
## Science Activity
