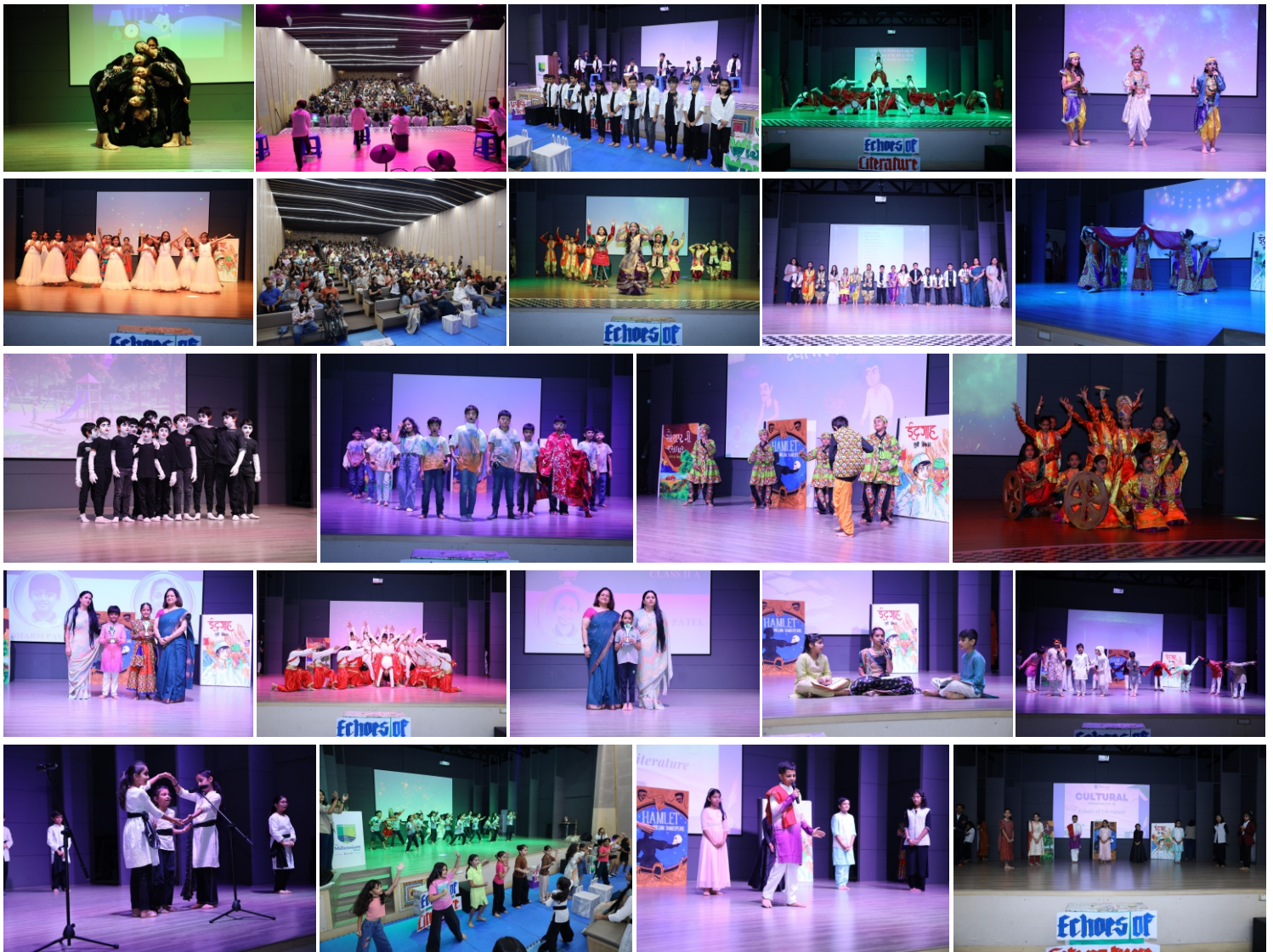
The stage at TMS Surat was lit with energy, creativity, and brilliance as our young Millennials from Classes III–V presented a vibrant Cultural Showcase.
