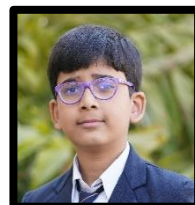

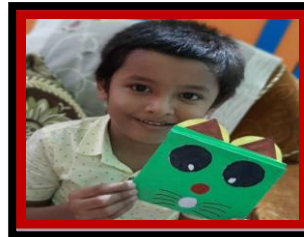
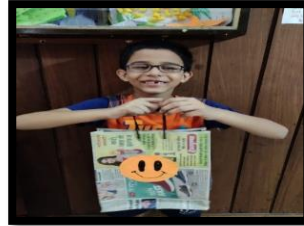


LOCK DOWN BLOOMS

Face Mask, 17th July 2020

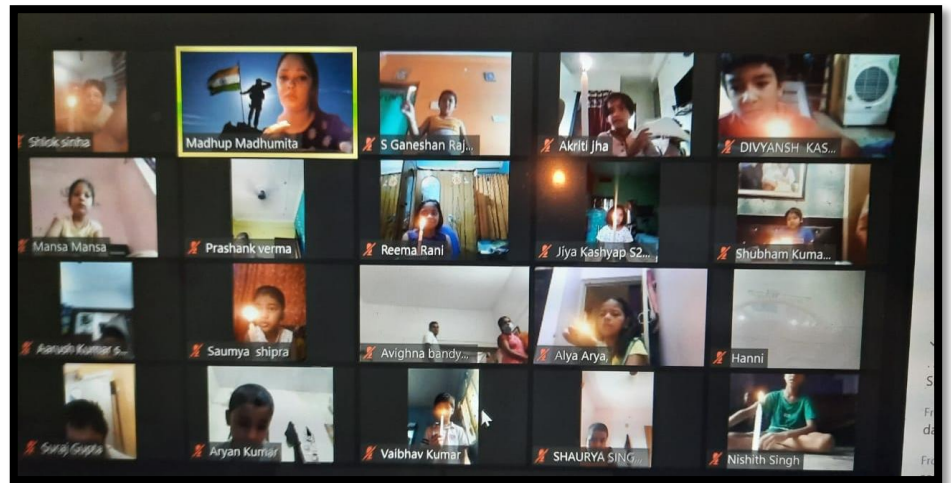

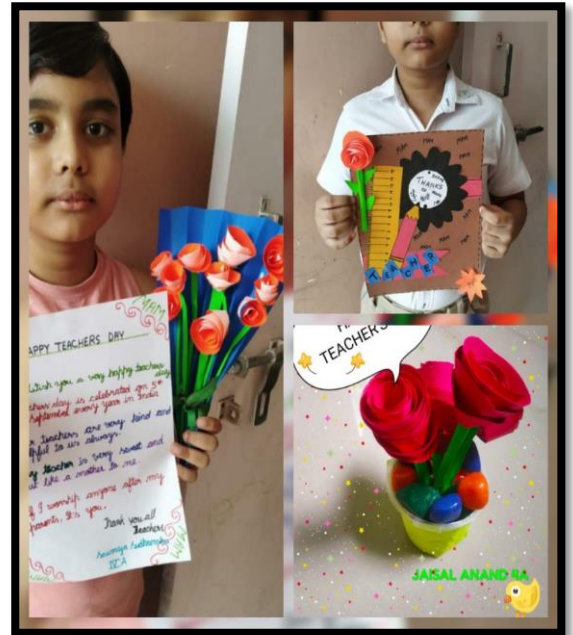


Teachers' day, 4th September 2020

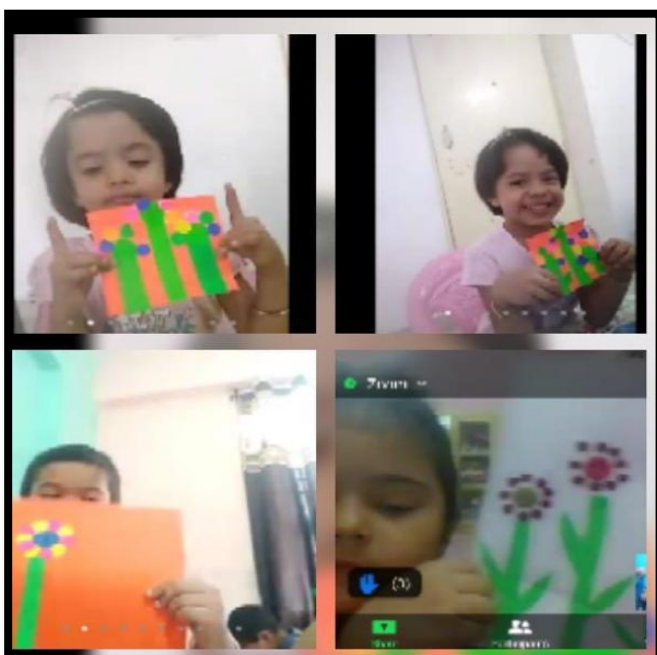
"A teacher is a compass that activates the magnets of curiosity, knowledge, and wisdom in the pupils."

"Go green, go genius, stamp the carbon, stand tall and stitch the ozone layer".

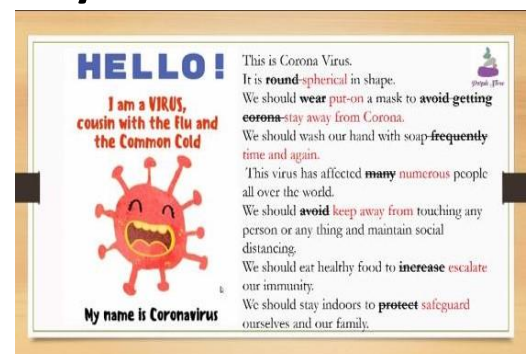

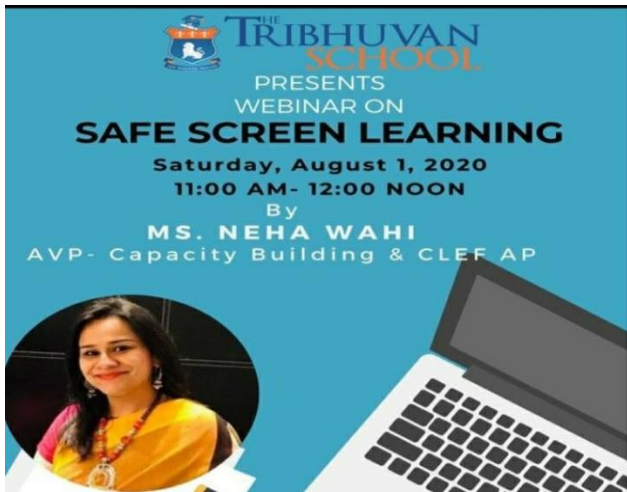
Webinars and Workshop – The Digital Way

"The world is shaped by two things the stories told and the memories they leave behind".

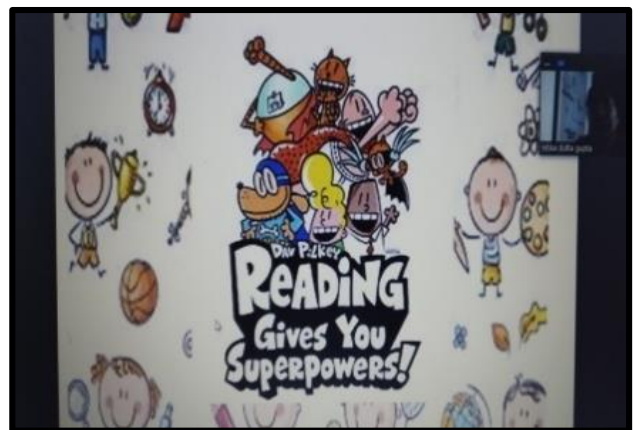
A story webinar organised for the students of grade III to V. The stories told by Mr. Vikram Sridhar captivated the young audience as he infused story telling with music and theatrical performance.



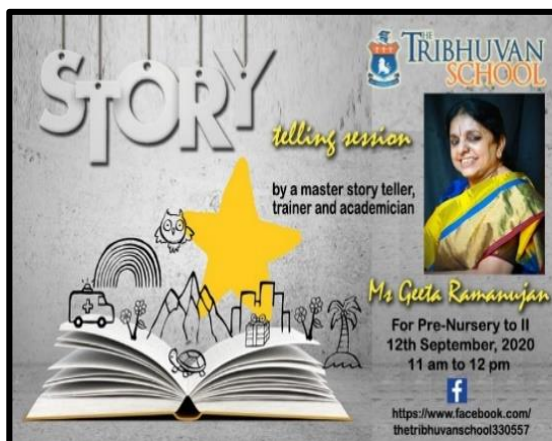
Reading skills, 28th August 2020

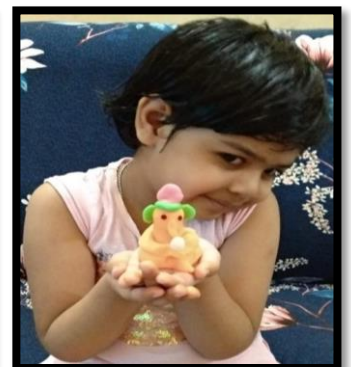

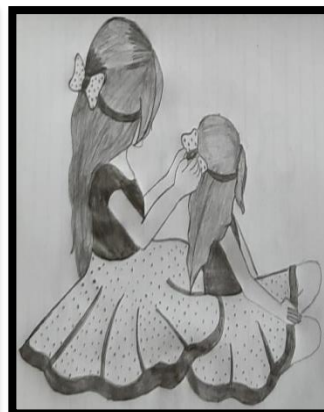
