FOUNDERS DAY: 9TH MAY 2020

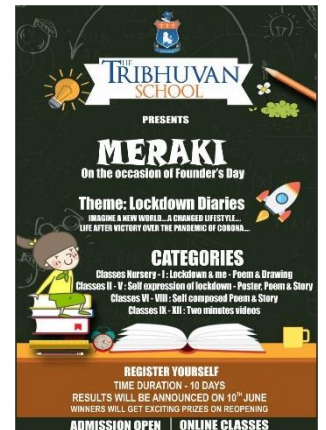

On this occasion a series of competitions was declared under the Title MERAKI - the creative soul aiming to draw out the creativity from among the budding talents of Tribhuvanites.



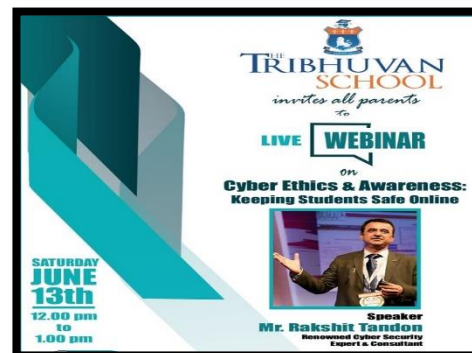

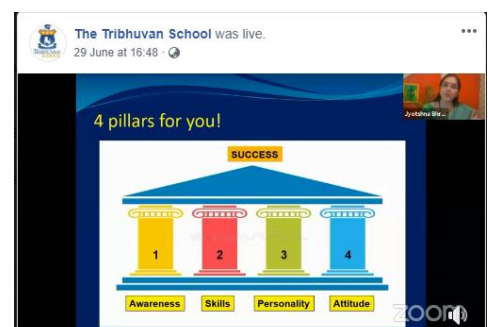

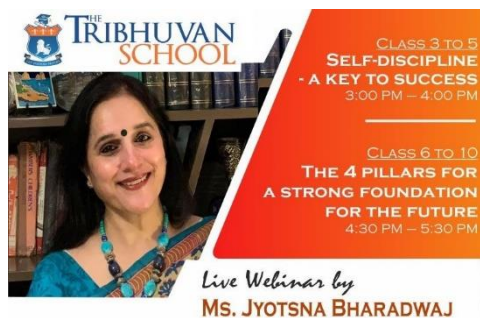


Realising the need for psychological wellbeing in the time of total uncertainty in every sphere the school organised a webinar titled

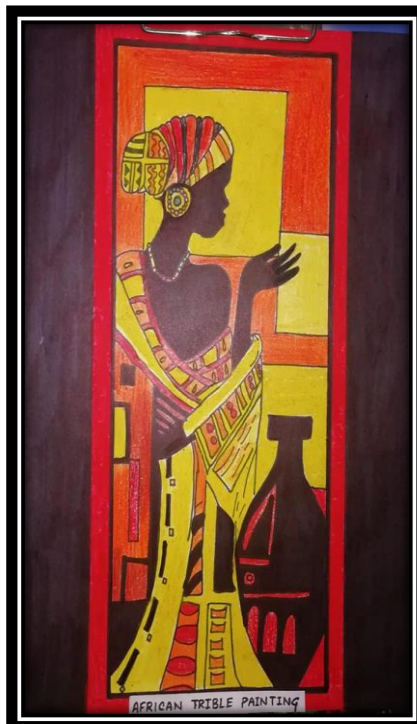
THE OTHERSIDE OF NEWSPAPER – AN ACTIVITY FOR STD VI

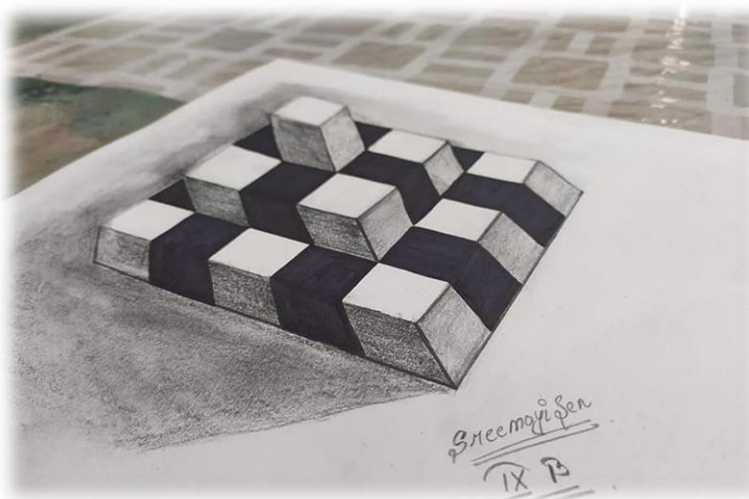
VEGGIE MAKEOVER – AN ACTIVITY FOR STD VIII
